- This text is making a contrast of desires and motivation. According to James what are the opposing motivations that the early church had?
- How is this section connected with the previous section of James (3:13-18)
- Why would James use words like "murder, adultery and enmity (*hostility towards God*)" in this section?
- How can "desiring and coveting" be so destructive?

## **GETTING PRACTICAL**

Discuss the following questions together as a group; be willing to share how challenges and trials have affected your life.

- 1. James asks a question in vs 4:1. How would you answer that same question today?
- 2. According to this section what are some keyways we can check our motivations?
- 3. James' challenge is to the early church to repent for desiring the things of this world. Is there anything you need to repent for that is leading you to have selfish desires?
