The CONTEXT of James

Unpack the biblical text to discover what the Scripture says or means about a particular topic. Bring attention to what events are surrounding the text. In this text James is writing to the persecuted church.

Central Theme: If you were to write a book or podcast title based on this passage, what would you call it?

- In v3-6 James gives three illustrations concerning the tongue. How is the tongue like a:
 - Bit in a horse's mouth?
 - How is it like the rudder of a ship?
 - How is it like a fire?
- James gives an illustration of a spring of water. What point is he making with this illustration?

GETTING PRACTICAL

Discuss the following questions together as a group; be willing to share how challenges and trials have affected your life.

Words are a powerful force and have a tremendous effect on others. They can ether influence other's lives positively or negatively.

- 1. What impact have people's words had on your life?
- 2. How could your words harm someone in your life this week?
- 3. How could your words build someone up this week?
