

Week 1: Who Gets to Choose?

Big Idea: God is the author of your Identity (Genesis 1 & 3)

GETTING STARTED (>10 min)

If your group is new or has new members take a few minutes to get acquainted. Have everyone give a short intro. Keep the conversation moving so the whole time is not taken up here.

IDENTITY ACTIVITY (10-15 min)

Step 1: Give a small piece of paper and a pen or pencil to everyone in the group.

Step 2: Ask them to answer this week's question by writing one or two sentences on the piece of paper. Do not have them write their names on the paper... it's a secret. **"Something you might not know about me is____"**

Step 3: Collect all the responses

Step 4: Read responses aloud. Ask people to guess after you read each one who they think might have written it.

Suggestions:

- *If you have a new group, nametags are helpful.
- *This should be fun...try voting if more than one person is nominated for a response.

- 1. Out: In what ways does culture and other people influence our Identity? What kind of impact does it have?
- 2. In: What are some dangers of simply looking within to find our Identity?
- 3. Up: Why should we look to God for our Identity?
- 4. If we look to God for our Identity, what perspective would you have about yourself?
- 5. Why is it important to help our kids, grandkids, and other young people to have a proper understanding of Identity? How can you be intentional in helping them look to God for their Identity?

GOING DEEPER

- 1. What does it mean to be the "Imago Dei" or image bearers of God?
- 2. According to Genesis 1:28-30 what does God want his image bearers to do?
- 3. Read Genesis 3:1-7 how does God's image bearers forget about their image? How does that impact their purpose?
