Acts 16:11 - 40

In Acts 16 we find Paul is in prison. He had done the right things but still he wound up in this desperate place. What do we do when doing the right thing lands us in the wrong place? Can we still trust God?

Big Idea: Learn to look for God's hand in all things

- Where do you see God's plan at work in today's passage?

- 1) Today we find that we can find God's hand at work in all things. When do you find it most challenging to trust God has a plan?
- 2) Today's passage is full of God's provision and care for His people. Can you remember a time where God cared for you in a difficult time?
- 3) When you do all the right things and don't get the right result how do you tend to respond? How do you see Paul and Silas responding and how could you respond differently?
- 4) What is the mission of all followers of Jesus? How can we respond when we are met with resistance in this mission?
