- How do the Thessalonians respond to Paul's message?
- How do the Bereans Respond to Paul's message?
- How does these two communities reception of Paul's message contrast each other?
- What was the primary motivation of each community?

- 1) What stood out to you about this week's message?
- 2) In what way does the Thessalonian church become a cautionary example for us?
- 3) The Berean church was praised for their character and their response to the Gospel message that Paul brought. What role do these Berean characteristics play in our response and maturity of faith (address one characteristic at a time)?
 - a. Hunger and eagerness for the truth.
 - b. Humility.
 - c. Submission to truth and Jesus' Lordship in our lives.
- 4) Is there one of these characteristics that stands out as a strength for you?
- 5) Which of these characteristics would you like to see be more prevalent in your life?
