Big Idea: Jesus' call is a call to character - to tend to the inward parts of our soul, not just its outward appearance

GETTING STARTED

SEARCH THE SCRIPTURES

Read the following Scriptures together and then use the questions below (or any you wish to add) to discuss the text and unpack its meaning.

- Have someone in your group read Matt. 23:25-28
- How does Jesus describe the Pharisees and religious leaders in Matthew 23:27-28? What is the source of their hypocrisy?
- What does it mean to clean the outside of the cup while leaving the inside dirty?
- What does it mean to be like whitewashed tombs?

GETTING PRACTICAL

- 1. Where have you seen hypocrisy displayed in the church?
- 2. How can we cultivate authenticity and integrity in our relationships with others and with God?
- 3. Do you think everyone is prone to hypocrisy? Why or why not?
- 4. What is the difference between personal and private devotion? How can we cultivate a greater amount of personal devotion?

TAKING IT HOME

This week is all about an inward-out change. Spend some time reflecting on how you can be transformed from the inside out. Here is a scripture and prayer to get you started.

Psalm 139:23-24

²³Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts!
